grounds by documenting gravestone inscriptions, church artifacts, and related historical materials.

## Property/Valuation Records & Census Substitutes

- Griffith's Valuation (1848-1868) - Ask about Ireland

  - Used to determine how much someone had to pay in taxes to the "Poor rate" and includes detailed information on where people lived in the mid-19th century.
- Tithe Applotment Books (1823-1837)
  - <http://titheapplotmentbooks.nationalarchives.ie/search/tab/index.jsp>
  - Used to determine the amount of money occupiers of agricultural holdings over 1 acre should pay in tithes to the Church of Ireland.
  - This is the next best thing to a pre-Famine Census in Ireland.

  - These maps from 1837-42 and 1888-1913 can help pinpoint exactly where an ancestor was living in Ireland.

### Irish American Specific Resources

  - In 1850, the Emigrant Savings Bank was founded by Irish Emigrant Society members to assist Irish immigrants escaping the devastating Potato Famine who had made their way to America. The bank became a vital resource for thousands of Irish immigrants, and meticulously maintained various volumes of records such as an Index Book, Test Book, Transfer-Signature-Test Book, and Deposit-Account Ledger– all of which include female account holders.

# Irish Genealogy Research Strategy

## Begin Your Research

Document what you know and work backwards systematically

## The First Challenge: Irish Place of Origin

### Don't Have Irish Location?

- Check vital records and obituaries
- Search naturalization papers

### Location Too General?

- Use church records
- Check local histories and newspapers

## Accessing Irish Records

### Key Record Collections

- Civil registration records
- Church records, census, land records

### Best Practices

- Cross-reference multiple sources
- Document all findings as you go

## Overcoming Brick Walls

### Cluster Research Techniques

- Research family, neighbors, associates
- Study migration patterns of groups

### Name Variations

- Consider spelling changes
- Check anglicized versions of names

### Boundary Changes

- Track locations through time
- Consider parish/administrative shifts

### DNA Testing Strategies

- Test multiple family lines
- Focus on Irish surname matches
