PERSI Explorer: Tracing Your Roots using the Periodical Source Index

The <u>PER</u>iodical <u>Source Index</u>, PERSI, is a subject index of more than 8,000 historical and genealogical magazine (a.k.a. periodical) titles, covering the United States, Canada, Great Britain, Ireland, and Australia. The periodicals include articles, indexes, abstracts, and transcriptions to materials.

The articles are indexed primarily by location, subject categories and/or record types, which include church records, court records, deeds, military, probate, vital records, and much more. With more than 3.1 million entries, PERSI is the one place to locate historical and genealogical articles on a variety of locations and records.


Why Periodicals?

- May miss up to one third of source materials, leads, record copies, transcriptions, indices and the like if we ignore data in periodical literature.
- Using periodicals supports the first point of the Genealogical Proof Standard—reasonably exhaustive research has been completed.

Periodical Source Index

PERSI is the premier subject index for genealogy and local history periodicals, and is produced by the staff of The Genealogy Center of the Allen County Public Library. This valuable resource provides more than 3 million citations to readily-available periodical sources.

Surnames

• One can filter large surname search results by keying state abbreviations, key words, dates and the like in the "Search Article Title" search box at the bottom of "Article Title" column.

Research Technique

• A dropdown menu provides one with the record types used in PERSI, and the ability to quickly identify articles in each of the twenty-three (23) categories.

Article Title Keyword

 One can keyword search across the entire PERSI database. This is only recommended for real specific terms. Broad terms will compromise the speed of getting search results.

Locations: United States, Canada, British Isles, and Other Countries

- Filtering a particular category of search results can be accomplished by keying locations, record descriptions, key words, etc. in the "Search Article Title" search box beneath the "Article Title" column.
- Once a location is chosen, a subject list will be available:

Tips for Searching PERSI

Tips and considerations when searching PERSI.

- Search using a variety of terms and abbreviations.
- Consider abbreviations such as:
 - England Eng.
- Baptist Bapt.
- Selected sel.

- Ireland Ire.
- Protestant Prot.Cemeteries cem.
- Germany Ger.
- Methodist Meth.
- Family fam.

- Company co.
- Biography bio.
- History hist.

- Consider word use such as:
 - Woman / Women
 - o Railroad / Railway / R.R.
 - Photos / Pictures
- Surnames were only indexed when an article was entirely based on a particular surname.
- PERSI is not an every surname index.
- Towns were not always indexed.
- Keyword search options:
 - o The search box at the top of your search results searches all four columns at once.
 - o There are additional search boxes at the bottom of the list that allows you to filter your results down by searching in each individual column.

- If you are wanting to filter your results down to a location, type the beginning part of the location or the location's abbreviation.
 - Example: Type NY in a search box to see articles that mention New York in the title or type Ind in a search box to see articles that mention Indiana in the title. Beware, this can bring up other results with those letters (i.e. WILliam for IL).
- If you are wanting to filter your results down to a specific timeframe, type the beginning part of a year to filter it down.
 - Example: Type 185 in a search box to see articles that mention the 1850s in the title.

Strength of PERSI

- Access to millions of articles that have a wealth of information from a variety of organizations across the globe concerning genealogical and historical records.
- With the citation from PERSI, you can obtain articles in a variety of different ways:
 - Visit The Genealogy Center and pull every article of interest from the original materials indexed into PERSI.
 - Contact the Publisher to see if they would be willing to share a copy of the article. This can sometimes be the fastest way to obtain an article.
 - Search your local library and/or archives to see if the periodical title, volume and issue is available. Use www.worldcat.org to see if there are any copies locally.
 - o Check with the publisher to see if they have copies available.
 - Request a copy of the article by using the PERSI Order Form:

 - Articles we cannot copy:
