



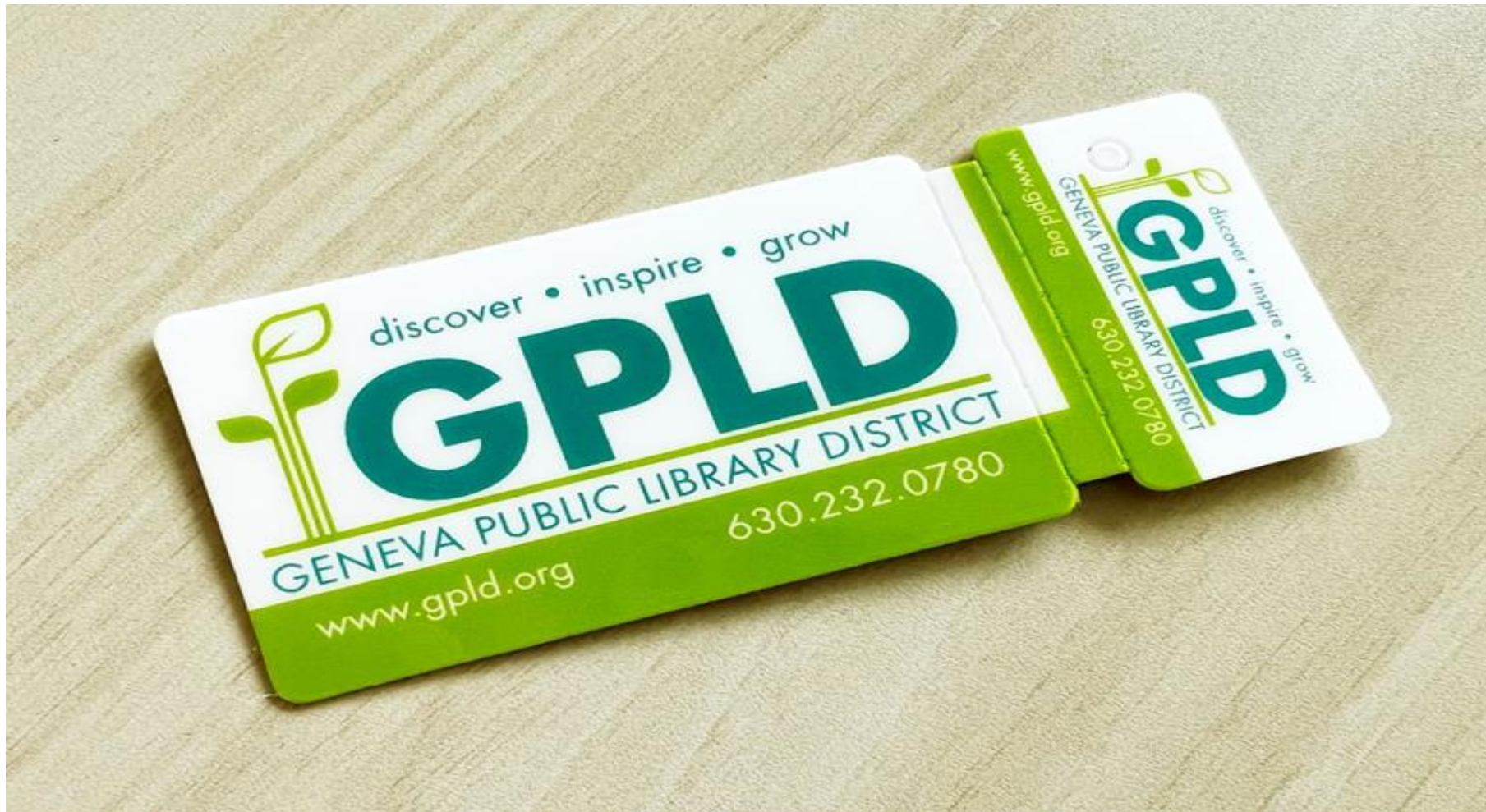
Sometimes I visit the Geneva Public Library. The library has rules that I must follow.



The library is a public place. A lot of people visit the library, and everyone is welcome. The library's rules help make everyone feel welcome.

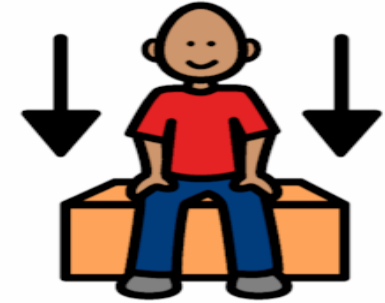
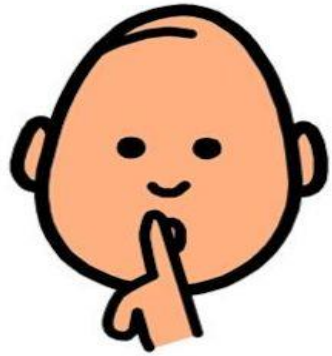


I will see books, DVDs, games, and other items on the shelves. If I have my library card, I can check out these items.

Keeping My Hands to Myself

The rules at the library are to speak in a quiet voice, use my walking feet, and keep my hands and feet to myself. Most people follow these rules.



A librarian's job is to answer questions, help find books and make guest passes for the computer. A librarian can help at the library.



Even though the rules at the library are to stay quiet, sometimes there may be noises. The librarian can help me if it gets too loud.



Sometimes I might need to make a sound or movement that is hard to control, such as humming or flapping my hands. This is okay. I will try to be quiet while I am in the library.





At the library, if someone or something is too loud or inappropriate, the librarian has tools that can help me. They can even help me find a quieter spot.



If I need support at the library, I can ask for a kit to help with bright lights, loud noises, and fidgeting.

Sometimes I might want to use something that another person is using. One of the expectations at the library is to wait for my turn.



When I am done visiting the library, I will put away the things I used and clean up the area where I was sitting.
