We accept gently-used books and magazines that are in good condition and that others would want to purchase. We cannot accept more than two boxes at a time.

Please recycle or discard the following at home:

- Books that are chewed, soiled, musty, moldy, tattered
- Books missing pages, or that have excessive writing in the text
- Books that smell of smoke or have water damage or mildew
- Books with broken binding

WE ACCEPT

- Hardcover and paperback fiction books for children, teens, and adults published in the last 5 years
- Rare, signed, or 1st Edition books
- Popular nonfiction books such as cookbooks, biographies, history, or memoirs
- Self-help, computer, medical, and financial guidebooks published in the last 2 years
- Magazines published in the last 3 months
- Classics in good condition

WE ARE UNABLE TO ACCEPT

- Any materials in poor condition
- Books or music on audiocassette or CD
- VHS tapes, DVDs and Blu-Rays
- Record albums
- Textbooks
- Encyclopedia sets
- Readers Digest Condensed books
- Outdated books about computers, self-help, medical, and financial information
- Catalogs
- Professional journals
- Odds and ends such as maps, calendars, journals, computer software, puzzles, and toys
