Inspiration Awaits

With so many amazing new materials, it can be hard to figure out what to check out next. Here are a few suggestions to build your TBR list.

First, use the catalog for inspiration. When you open up Evergreen, you will see scrolling lists of New York Times Best Sellers. Just click on the cover to see if the item is available now or you can place it on hold. Evergreen will pull from all the libraries in our consortium to get the material to you as soon as possible. Also, after you click on an item, scroll down past summary, subject and genre, to see the "Awards, Reviews, & Suggested Reads" section. Evergreen has similar titles and authors to browse.

Next, make sure to follow Kendallville Public Library on GoodReads. Many staff members have a shelf you can browse, find inspiration and add to your "Want to Read" list. GoodReads also has a huge variety of curated lists to inspire you.

Finally, make sure to use our apps. The MobileKPL app has a scrolling list of Amazon best sellers listed for inspiration. Hoopla has sections of Popular

and Featured titles, and once you borrow a few, it will start to give you suggestions. Libby can help you find items based on newness, popularity and what is available now. Not sure how to use the apps listed? Sign up for an appointment in the adult department for a quick tutorial.

And if you are not in to technology, it is always a great idea to browse our displays, staff picks and BookPage.

Finally, don't forget about items beyond books. One cool new item is the Tonies in the youth department. Not sure what Tonies are or how to use them? Essentially, these boxes play a story and music when the characters are placed on

top of the box. Characters include: Disney, Peppa Pig, Frozen and Disney Princess. No wifi is required so they're great for road trips and bedtime.

We look forward to learning more about our new staff and we are excited to grow at our libraries.




