



Selected Poems by John Donne (1572-1631)

John Donne is considered one of the greatest of the English "Metaphysical Poets." Samuel Johnson coined this term to refer to a poet who extends a metaphor throughout a poem. This month we look at Donne's poems "The Flea," "The Relic," "A Valediction: Forbidding Mourning," "A Valediction: of Weeping," "Divine Meditation XIII: What if this present were the world's last night.



"Meditations 1 and 2," by René Descartes (1596-1650)

René Descartes made notable contributions to mathematics. Because of the philosophical perspective he adopted during the sixteenth century, a time of scientific awakening, he's considered a key figure in the development of modern philosophy. In his Meditations, Descartes sets out to prove the existence of God, and the distinction between mind and body. In "Mediation I," he lays out the foundations of philosophical skepticism. In "Meditation II," he demonstrates how the mind is more easily known than the body. He achieves this through a rigorous, one might say autobiographical, examination of his own mind.

Frequently Asked Ouestions

Where do I find objects to print?

If you want to use objects that have already been designed, you can go to www.thingiverse.com and search using keywords. Once you've found what you want, download the files and send them to us at hpl3dp@gmail.com or fill out the form on our website at myhpl.libnet.info/3d-printing-8572.

Can I design my own objects?

Yes! We encourage you to go to www.tinkercad.com and learn how to design your own parts. There are lessons right there on the website. You can set up a free account in just a few minutes. Once you've designed your part, you can export the file and email it to us.

How much does it cost to print an item?

The only thing you pay for is the PLA filament you use. We charge \$1.00 per hour of print time. A typical print can take 4 or 5 hours.

How large can my print be?

Our printer can produce objects up to 11 x 11 x 15 inches. However, your print time must be less than 12 hours so that we can accomplish the print during normal library business hours. Therefore, certain objects will not fall into the range of acceptability.

Is there anything we will not print?

We will not print objects that are prohibited by law (i.e. weapons).


