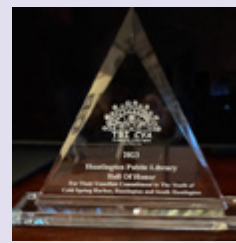


Huntington Village Art Walk

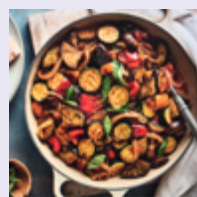

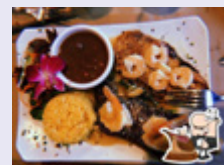

The Great Books Discussion Group has been in existence at the Huntington Public Library for the past eighteen years. As one of its founders steps away from his leadership role, several members have agreed to share the management of the group.

We invite you to join our exploration of some of the highly regarded "Great Books" through a process of Shared Inquiry and discussion. No prior knowledge of the texts is necessary, but do bring your curiosity and enthusiasm for reading and understanding text. The group's task is primarily to focus its discussion on the text and pre-arranged questions, apart from any prior knowledge about the author and/or the context in which it was written. The final half-hour is open to any additional information about the text. The process of shared inquiry and discussion usually evokes feelings of pleasure and satisfaction. One never leaves the group with the same thoughts with which one arrived!

We will be reading selections from Great Conversations vol. 2 (available at the front desk for \$10)

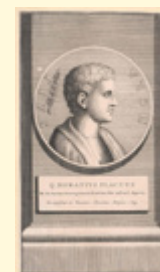
where the texts can take many shapes: poems, essays, short stories, and chapters from books. We thank the Friends of the Library for their generous contribution toward the purchase of the anthologies.

"Ode 3.2" by Horace (65-8 BC) and "Dulce et Decorum Est" by Wilfred Owen (1893-1918)

This month we examine two war poems. The first is by the Roman poet Horace and contains the famous line "Dulce et decorum est pro patria mori" ("It is sweet and fitting to die for one's country.") Horace, a soldier himself, was the son of a former slave. Wilfred Owen wrote his poem based on his experiences in the trenches of France in the First World War. He started to write poetry seriously while convalescing from war wounds, then went back to the front, and was killed a week before Armistice was declared.

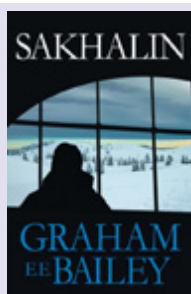
This month we look at the story of the warrior, Samson, the last of the judges of the ancient Israelites, as told in the Book of Judges.

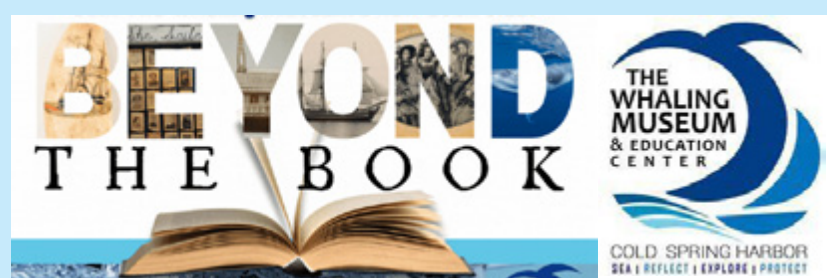

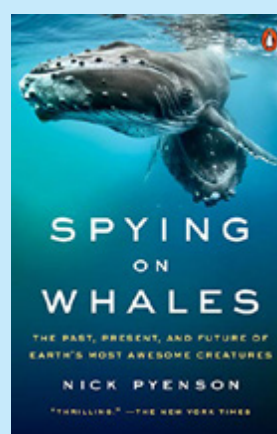


Beyond the Book with The Whaling Museum

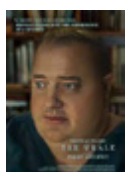

The disaster marked an important milestone in journalism history because young lithographer Nathaniel Currier rushed to make an image of the fire for the New York Sun, which put out extra editions using the illustration, one of the first times a daily newspaper had an illustration with a breaking news story. The loss of the Lexington also led to an important Supreme Court decision and helped lead to tougher safety regulations for steamboats. A book signing will follow the presentation.

Where do I find objects to print?

If you want to use objects that have already been designed, you can go to www.thingiverse.com and search using keywords. Once you've found what you want, download the files and send them to us at hpl3dp@gmail.com.

Can I design my own objects?

Yes! We encourage you to go to www.tinkercad.com and learn how to design your own parts. There are lessons right there on the website. You can set up a free account in just a few minutes. Once you've designed your part, you can export the file and email it to us.

How much does it cost to print an item?

The only thing you pay for is the PLA filament you use. We charge **\$1.00** per hour of print time. A typical print can take 4 or 5 hours.

How large can my print be?

Our printer can produce objects up to 11 x 11 x 15 inches. However, your print time must be less than 12 hours so that we can accomplish the print during normal library business hours. Therefore, certain objects will not fall into the range of acceptability.

Is there anything we will not print?

We will not print objects that are prohibited by law (i.e. weapons).

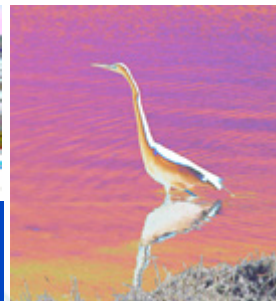
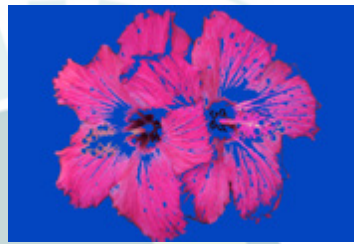

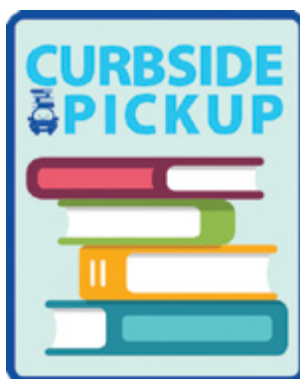
