Tour of Sherwood-Jayne House in East Setauket

Join us for a tour of the Sherwood-Jayne Farmhouse. Built in colonial Setauket around 1730, the Sherwood-Jayne Farmhouse survives today in its original 18th-century agrarian landscape. It served as the home of the Jayne family, including William Jayne II, a prominent Loyalist during the Revolutionary War. The Jaynes maintained the farm for over 150 years before selling it in 1908 to New York attorney Howard Sherwood, the founder of Preservation Long Island. Sherwood was an early advocate for historic preservation and an important figure in the Colonial Revival movement. He restored the farm to its 18th-century appearance and used the house to showcase his collection of American and European antiques. Today, Preservation Long Island operates the Sherwood-Jayne Farm as a house museum and continues Howard Sherwood's mission of advocating for historic preservation on Long Island. **The Sherwood-Jayne House is located at 55 Old Post Rd, Setauket- East Setauket, NY 11733. 3D Printers are now available in both buildings! You can search for designs at www.thingiverse.com, download the files, and fill out the form on our website: myhpl.libnet.info/3d-printing-8572. Or, you can create your own designs at www.tinkercad.com. Online lessons teach you how to use the software to design unique objects. You can export the file and send it to us for printing.

We charge \$1.00 per hour of print time that gets used towards purchasing the PLA filament. A typical print takes 4 or 5 hours, with a maximum print time of 12 hours. We cannot run the machines when we are closed. Our printers can produce objects up to 11x11x15 inches as long as the print time can be completed during normal library hours. We will not print objects that are prohibited by law (i.e., weapons or parts of weapons).

Social Work Services Available

We have partnered with **Stony Brook University** to offer a variety of services as part of their **Healthy Library Program (HeLP)**, a partnership with the **Public Libraries of Suffolk County, the Suffolk Cooperative Library System Outreach Services Department**, and is supported by the **American Heart Association of Long Island**.

A panel of students currently in training in the fields of social work, public health, and nursing, along with a faculty supervisor, will be available onsite at the **Main Library** to provide blood pressure screenings, and to answer health-related questions and provide reliable, evidence-based information on a wide variety of health topics such as heart disease, diabetes, understanding medications and much more. Students are also available to direct patrons to community resources, help fill out paperwork for social services, connect with housing resources and assist with finding a healthcare provider. These students will have an information table at the **Main Library on Tuesday, September 12, Wednesday, September 26, Tuesday, October 24, and Tuesday, November 7 from 10:30 am – 1:00 pm.**

We will also have Social Work interns available in both buildings to assist with various social services needs. MUSEUM PASSES *Please check with museums in advance, hours are subject to change.*

There are two types of museum passes available for patrons over 18-years of age who are HPL cardholders in good standing: **Print-On-Demand** or **Pick Up and Return** passes. You can make a reservation in-person, by telephone, or online at www.myhpl.org, under the On-Site Services tab. Reservations may be made up to two months in advance and a household can reserve two passes per month. **Check with the museum prior to your visit for hours of operation and visitation guidelines. Print-On-Demand passes can be printed out at the time you reserve them or at any time up to the date of your reservation. They do not need to be returned and are valid *only* on the day of your reservation.



Pick Up and Return passes can be checked out for three days and are obtained at the Reference Desk at our Main Branch and must be returned there.

Please note: a \$10.00 per day late fee is charged if a Pick Up and Return pass is returned past the scheduled due date. After three (3) days past due, the patron will additionally be charged the replacement cost of the museum membership.
