According to the Bylaws of the Huntington Public Library, the Library shall be governed by a Board of Trustees, as a municipal corporate entity, (hereafter referred to as "the Board") consisting of five (5) members, each of whom shall be elected in accordance with law by the qualified voters of the Huntington Public Library District (serving the same area as the Huntington Union Free School District #3). Board members

shall serve for a term of five years, and they may be re-elected for additional terms

Trustee Eligibility. A Trustee shall be a registered voter in the Huntington Library District and shall take and subscribe to an oath of office, which shall be filed as provided by law. A Trustee may not be a current Huntington Public Library employee. Two or more members of the same immediate family may not serve concurrently on the Board. The library's legal counsel will act as the final determinant in situations where there are questions/issues regarding the interpretation or application of the foregoing requirements.

To become a candidate for a library trustee position, you must be a resident of the Huntington Union Free School District #3, submit a petition, signed by at least 25 qualified residents of the school district, to the Library's administration office by Monday, March 4, 2024 at 5:00pm. Petitions are available at the Huntington Public Library at 338 Main Street, Huntington, NY 11743. 3D Printers are now available in both buildings! You can search

for designs at www.thingiverse.com, download the files, and fill out the form on our website:

myhpl.libnet.info/3d-printing-8572.

Or, you can create your own designs at www.tinkercad. com. Online lessons teach you how to use the software to design unique objects. You can export the file and send it to us for printing.

We charge \$1.00 per hour of print time that gets used towards purchasing the PLA filament. A typical print takes 4 or 5 hours, with a maximum print time of 12 hours. We cannot run the machines when we are closed. Our printers can produce objects up to 11x11x15 inches as long as the print time can be completed during normal library hours. We will not print objects that are prohibited by long (i.e., weapones or parts of weapones)

by law (i.e., weapons or parts of weapons).


