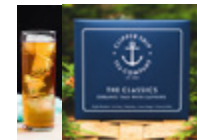

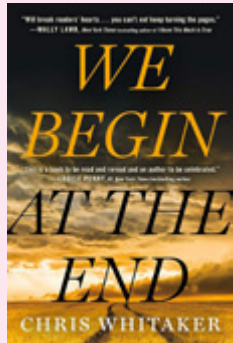

"Planning and Democracy" (from the Road to Serfdom) by Friedrich Hayek (1899-1992)

The Second World War was a crucible for the formulation of F. A. Hayek's economic theories. According to the Austro-English Hayek, it was a mistake to view the central planning and coordination of the war effort as a validation of a socialistic system. Fascism and communism have more in common with each other than they do with the political economies of free market democracies, he argues. Hayek is considered an advocate of certain strands of modern libertarianism, and this selection comes from his best-known book, *The Road to Serfdom*.



"Distributive Justice" (from Collected Papers) by John Rawls (1921-2002)

John Rawls was a leading modern political philosopher. In his paper "Distributive Justice," Rawls displays his passionate concern with the question of whether a modern democratic society can equitably distribute rights, responsibilities, and resources. Or, you can create your own designs at www.tinkercad.com. Online lessons teach you how to use the software to design unique objects. You can export the file and send it to us for printing.

We charge \$1.00 per hour of print time that gets used towards purchasing the PLA filament. A typical print takes 4 or 5 hours, with a maximum print time of 12 hours.

We cannot run the machines when we are closed. Our printers can produce objects up to 11x11x15 inches as long as the print time can be completed during normal library hours. We will not print objects that are prohibited by law (i.e., weapons or parts of weapons).
