HOW TO COMPLETE THIS BOOKLET

This booklet is designed to enhance your experience of Women's History Month through action prompts and use of resources through the library.

For direction and guidance, you are encouraged to visit your local library – or any of our locations throughout Queens – and discuss your ideas and thoughts with our librarians.

Review the prompts in this journal and write a list of how you want to complete them.

On pages 4-15, write down what you chose to complete each prompt as well as your related thoughts, feelings and reflections. Don't forget to add a motivational sticker in the space provided on each page.

Once you have completed at least 8 out of 12 prompts, visit a QPL location and show the librarian(s) your booklet to win a prize!

NOTE

You can count something twice! For example, if you attend one of our Women's History Month themed storytimes, this counts as attending a Women's History Month program & reading a book by a female author.

or similar platform.**



Watch a documentary about a female figure.



Write a short story, poem, or song about a woman who inspires you.
