



SWAN Libraries + App

Take a library with you wherever you go!

SWAN Library Services has rolled out a new and improved version of its digital app. It's free and available for iOS and Android devices.

Download the app and enter your library card number and PIN (last 4 digits of your phone number). Within seconds, you will see the status of all your checked-out items and titles on hold in the Account section.

The Discover icon shows images of New & Available Now books, eBooks, audiobooks, music and movies. With a few quick taps, you can easily place items on hold. Use the Manage Categories button to expand your search to include:

- Science Kits
- Discovery Packs
- ✓ Tech To Go

Do you have a specific title in mind? Just enter it in the search bar.

With the app, you won't need to bring your physical library card to the library. Use the Card feature and scan your barcode at the self-check station or the Member Services Desk. The Linked Accounts option lets you add the library card numbers of other members of your household so you can check out items to their accounts.
