Storage & Backups

- Don't rely on any single storage location or media type
 - Many copies, stored in many places, keeps things safe!
- External Hard Drives
 - o I prefer SSD (solid state drive), but HDD (Hard Disk Drives) can be adequate too. It depends on your storage needs.
- The cloud What I currently use:
 - DropBox
 - Google Photos
 - Google Drive
 - I mainly use Google Drive for my research related photographs.

Organization Tips

- File Naming
 - Be concise, unique, & consistent.
- Folder Organization
 - The simpler, the better.
 - Try not to create too many subfolders because this can affect how well your computer can search for specific images.
