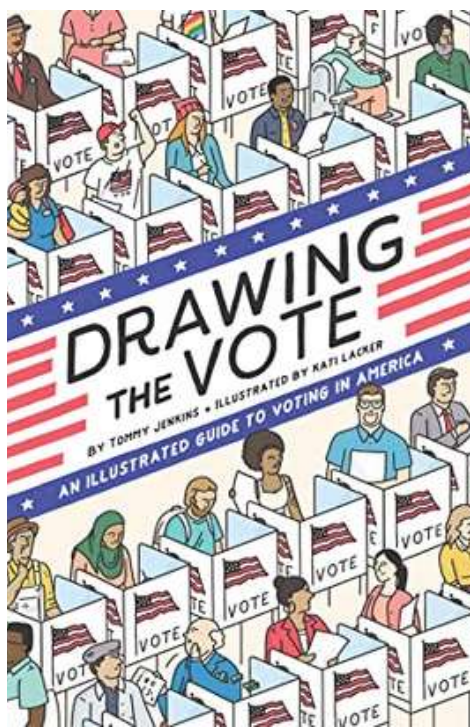

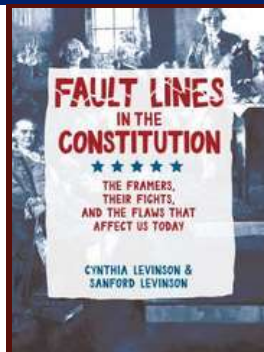

FAULT LINES IN THE CONSTITUTION

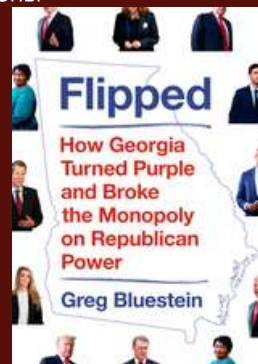
