



Five Board of Trustee positions (one 2-year term and four 4-year terms) are up for election in the Geneva Public Library District on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. Election packets are also available at the Customer Service Desk in the lobby of the Library at 227 South 7<sup>th</sup> Street, Geneva. Library hours are Monday through Thursday: 9am to 9pm; Friday: 9am to 6pm; Saturday: 9am-5pm, and Sunday: 12-5pm. Petitions may be circulated beginning Tuesday, September 20, 2022. The Library does not track receipt of any candidate packets that are picked up during the petition process. 2. [Nominating petition sheets, SBE Form P-4](#) with at least 50 signatures (numbered, notarized, and fastened). If applying for 2-year term, please note that in the “office” box of the petition.
3. Receipt from County for filing Statement of Economic Interest
4. [Optional Loyalty Oath, SBE Form P-1C \(notarized\)](#)

**Qualifications:** Qualified elector of the Library District with one-year residency in the Library District at the time nomination papers are filed.

A person is not eligible to serve as a Library Trustee who, at the time of filing nomination papers, is in arrears in the payment of a tax or other indebtedness due to the Library District or has been convicted by any court located in the United States of any infamous crime, bribery, perjury, or other felony.
