Highland Park Public Library Naming Opportunities



Youth Services

\$250,000 Youth Services Department

A whimsical and vibrant reimagination of the Youth Services Department to foster literacy, learning, and creative play for children of all ages, and provide opportunities for families to connect with each other.

\$100,000 Middle School Room

A new space with the privacy, safety and comfort teens need to feel relaxed and welcome at the Library, whether they are studying for a test, hanging out with friends, or relaxing with a good book.

\$75,000 Activity Room

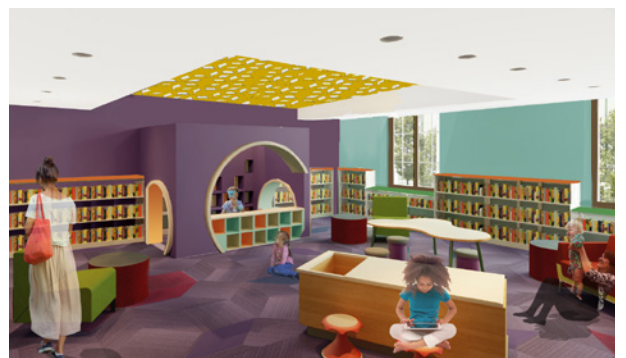
An enclosed space for youth to engage in a wide range of programs — from storytime and craft classes to game nights and yoga time.

\$50,000 Discovery Room

A dedicated space for young children to develop language and pre-literacy skills through age-appropriate books and materials.

\$25,000 Computer Area

This digital hub equips youth with computer software and internet access to support learning and build new technology skills.

\$15,000 Discovery Nook

The Discovery Nook encourages our littlest patrons to stimulate their imagination and pique their curiosity with open-ended play materials.

Highland Park Public Library Naming Opportunities

Adult Services

\$250,000 Adult Services Department

A dedicated adult and teen space full of comfortable seating for the enjoyment of reading, worktables for collaboration and quiet study, and computers for exploring and research.

\$100,000 Technology Access Center

Part of our new Media Services Department, the Technology Access Center provides access for all to updated computers, software, internet, and copy/print services. Patrons can also learn new digital skills and receive technology support.

\$25,000 – Study Rooms (8)

\$50,000

The popular demand of our study rooms prompted an expansion of private spaces for patrons to reserve. Now with eight private study areas, rooms can accommodate from 2 – 10 people for collaborative work.

\$25,000 Digital Media Lab

Adjacent to our Media Services Department, the soundproofed Media Lab gives patrons access to equipment and software to create content and bring ideas to life. Equipment includes 3D printing, augmented reality headsets, mobile webcams, etc.

\$2,500 Book Stacks

An ideal way to honor someone in your life who loves books. Each stack has a dedicated nameplate ready for inscription.

Additional Spaces

\$250,000 Auditorium

The Auditorium seats 87 patrons and is used for a range of programs, including lectures, concerts, author visits, and film screenings.

\$100,000 Main Lobby

Part of the original 1931 building, the historic main lobby is a welcoming and safe space for patrons to ask questions, check out materials, and find out what's happening at the Library.

\$75,000 Meeting Room

This multipurpose space is a gathering place and reception area for Library events, workshops, adult and family programming, as well as a space for community organizations to reserve for local events.

Donor Wall

Prominently located in the main Library entrance, the Donor Wall is a personalized tribute to recognize each individual contributor at three levels: Benefactors (\$10,000+), Sponsors (\$5,000-\$9,999), and Donors (\$2,500-\$4,999).
